

INDIANA GANG IS ACCUSED OF RACINE HOLDUP

Racine, Wis., Nov. 21.—[Special.]—John Dillinger, Indiana desperado and prison breaker, wanted in many cities for bank robbery, and Charles Makley and Harry Plerpont, two members of his gang, today were named in warrants charging them with participating in the holdup of the American Bank and Trust company here yesterday.

A policeman and an assistant bank cashier were shot; the bank president, a woman employé, and a policeman were kidnaped and later released 85 miles from the scene, and \$27,700 in cash and an undetermined amount in bonds were carried away by the bandits.

The warrants were issued after a dozen witnesses of yesterday's holdup were shown police pictures of men involved, it is alleged, in a jail delivery from the Michigan City, Ind., prison and in the slaying of Sheriff Jess Sarber at Lima, O., when desperados released Dillinger from the county jail there on Oct. 12.

Each of the three is charged in the warrants with bank robbery while armed. In Wisconsin this charge carries a sentence of from 3 to 33 years.

Witnesses also were shown pictures of Russell Lee Clark, 33, and Joseph Burns, 40, who were among the convicts who fled the Indiana penitentiary in September. Chief of Police Lutter said there was no identification of these men and that they are only suspects.

Concrete evidence was found today that the Indiana gang of bandits has been in this district for nearly two weeks. Three Indiana troopers came to Milwaukee to seek them after \$1,500 in liberty bonds, stolen in one of the bank robberies in that state, were paid over to a Milwaukee automobile dealer on Nov. 10.

WOUNDED SUSPECT ARRESTED.

Achile Jarrett, 24 years old, 3930 Prairie avenue, colored, was arrested yesterday in a pool room at 430 East 37th street when he refused to explain how he received a bullet wound in his right arm.
