

# DILLINGER GANG NAMED AS CHIEF PUBLIC ENEMIES

## Convicts Head New Police Crime List.

In another move to stamp out criminal gangs which have been preying on the Chicago area recently the authorities yesterday issued a list of 21 new public enemies in the form of bulletins which are being placed in the hands of every policeman in Chicago and Cook county. The officers are warned to take no chance with them. Pictures of the outlaws are carried in the bulletins.

John Dillinger, leader of the desperate band of escaped Indiana convicts, heads the list as public enemy No. 1. The chronicle is conspicuous by its new names. Absent are many familiar names identified with prohibition gangland under Al Capone, although a few appear, such as Murray Humphries.

### Two Women Are Named.

They have been supplanted by newcomers, largely from other states and towns, associated with kidnaping, murder, robbery, racketeering, and so on, showing a change in the complexion of crime. For the first time women are included in the list. The list, besides Dillinger, includes:

**HARRY PIERPONT**, 40 years old, wanted for murder, bank robberies, and escape from the Michigan City prison.

**JOHN HAMILTON**, 41, sought for the slaying of Sergt. William T. Shanley in Chicago, bank holdups, and Michigan City prison escape.

**CHARLES MAKLEY**, 50, bank holdups and Michigan City escape.

**RUSSELL CLARK**, 39, bank robberies and Michigan City escape.

**WALTER DETRICK**, 31, Michigan City escape and bank banditry.

**JOSEPH FOX**, 32, bank holdups and Indiana prison escape.

**PEARL ELLIOTT**, woman associate of Dillinger and his men.

**MARY KINDER**, friend of the Elliott woman and Dillinger.

These names include the known roster of the Dillinger outfit and police are warned that the men named are dangerous. The police are especially warned to shoot Dillinger if he resists.

The new public enemy list includes Murray Humphries and the following, some of them Touhy followers, some downstate hoodlums, and the rest gunmen of no particular gang:

**TOM TOUHY**, 41, brother of Roger Touhy, wanted for kidnaping.

**CHARLES ICE WAGON CONNORS**, sought for abduction.

**EDWARD LA RUE**, 31, alleged kidnaper.

**BASIL BANGHART**, 35, wanted for kidnaping.

**CHARLES FRANCIS McGUIRE**, 50, alleged kidnaper.

**JOHN [JACK] KLUTAS**, kidnap gang chief.

**W. A. HENRICHSEN**, ex-county highway policeman, alleged kidnaper.

**LUDWIG [DUTCH LOUIE] SCHMIDT**, alleged kidnaper and robber.

**HOMER VAN METER**, bank robber.

**JOSEPH BURNS**, wanted for bank holdups.

**MERRIT R. LONGBRAKE**, bank robber.

**GEORGE NELSON**, sought for bank jobs.

The list was compiled as a result of the rise to power of the Dillinger and Touhy gangs. From time to time it will be augmented, containing, as this one does, pictures, Bertillon measurements, and fingerprints, police announced. It is hoped to spread this information over the country.

### Aids Work of Stege.

At the state's attorney's office, where the list was originated, it was explained it was an additional move to aid the work of the special police detail now commanded by Capt. John Stege.

This is the first time that a new public enemy list has failed to list such local celebrities as "Machine Gun Jack" McGurn, "Spike" O'Donnell, James [Fur] Sammons, and others. One reason is that some of them are now in prison or out of the rackets.

## Doctor Sued by Doctor on Malpractice Charge

Dr. Fred S. Danziger, 4043 North Sawyer avenue, yesterday filed the declaration of a suit for \$250,000 in the Circuit court against Dr. A. James Larkin, 7300 South Shore drive. The declaration charges malpractice. It alleges that Dr. Larkin treated Dr. Danziger in January, 1932, and as a result of the treatments Dr. Danziger's illness was aggravated and he had to employ other physicians.
